Call for Papers Macroeconomic and financial aspects of climate change

The Universidad Carlos III de Madrid is organizing a conference on "The macroeconomic and financial aspects of climate change" in cooperation with the *European Economic Review*. The conference will be held in person at Universidad Carlos III de Madrid on November 15th, 2024. The conference is adjoint to the Banco de España annual research conference, which this year will be focused on the same issue and will take place the day before in the Bank's premises.

The main theme of the conference is broad, though we are looking for research that can clarify the implications of climate change for the conduct of monetary policy, financial regulation, financial aspects of the green transition, and other macroeconomic policy responses. While it is important to quantify the economic implications of climate change, we are interested in papers that can offer well-developed analysis as to the implications of climate change for economic policy. Both empirical and theoretical papers are welcome.

The program will include presentations from academic experts on the field, followed by a discussant.

Selected papers presented at the conference will be considered for a special issue of the *European Economic Review* (EER). Authors submitting a paper should indicate whether or not they wish their paper to be considered for the special issue. The special issue will be edited by Evi Pappa, Fernanda Nechio and Òscar Jordà. Papers will be refereed according to usual EER standards. However, the editors will expedite the editorial process. Authors are thus strongly encouraged to present papers that are already relatively complete and polished as the turnaround will be quick.

The **deadline** for submitting papers is **April 30, 2024**. To submit a paper, please email your draft in PDF format to eerevi.pappa@gmail.com. Selected contributors will be notified by May 25, 2024.
