Access to the Special Value Collection

The Special Value Collection, comprising more than 16,000 printed and manuscript items from the 15th-19th centuries, is an important part of the bibliographic collection and of great interest as regards the study of economic history and law in Spain. It is a valuable resource for the study of subjects such as the regulation of economic activities, with a collection of 3,000 laws and regulations from the 16th-19th centuries; socioeconomic thought from the School of Salamanca and the Enlightenment; the history of the Banco de España and the Spanish financial system; trade and relations with the Americas; geographical works and Spanish travel literature, etc.

Access to this Collection is restricted to researchers, for conservation reasons. Those interested should apply in writing:

- Declaring the nature and subject of the research work to be performed, which must necessarily be related to the copies of the Special Value Collection they wish to consult.
- Providing suitably documented proof that they are engaged in research work.
- Explicitly accepting all Library rules and regulations.
