Financial Education Plan 2013-2017

Second Financial Education Day to be held on 3 October

The second Financial Education Day, held as part of the Financial Education Plan (FEP), an initiative backed by the Banco de España and the Spanish National Securities Market Commission (CNMV) with the support of numerous other institutions, will be taking place on 3 October 2016.

The CNMV will be hosting the event which will be attended by its President, Elvira Rodríguez, the Governor of the Banco de España, Luis M. Linde, and the State Secretary for Economic Affairs and Competitiveness, Íñigo Fernández de Mesa. The event will also include the awarding of the *IV Premios Escolares del Plan* [4th FEP School Prizes] and the first edition of the *Premio Finanzas para Todos* [Finance for All Prize] for the best financial education initiatives in Spain.

A dedicated website has been set up (http://www.diadelaeducacionfinanciera.es/) to accompany the event, giving more information about the scheduled activities. The FEP's partner institutions have prepared a full programme of exciting initiatives to raise awareness of the importance of financial planning, saving and access to information as the basis for decisions about money.

A financial education hotline has been set up on 900 54 54 54, where members of the public can find help resolving any doubts they may have about managing their personal finances.

Alongside the CNMV and the Banco de España, the institutions taking part in the Financial Education Day include the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Competitiveness, the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport, educational and consumer associations, together with financial institutions, through their sector associations, foundations and other organisations.
