1 Introduction

Microdata on the structures of **non-financial** corporate groups. The main characteristics are:

- a) Mass access to the data on the structure of consolidated **non-financial** corporate groups whose parent companies are domiciled in Spain, but whose subsidiaries are located anywhere in the world.
- b) Data relating to a non-statistical sample of non-financial corporate groups.
- c) Availability of identifying variables that allow each corporate group to be characterised.
- d) Data relating to 2020 and historical information for groups that have not reported information in the last four years using information from 2016.
- e) More than 13,000 groups.
- f) Exit data in .csv format.

An ancillary file is also provided. It contains information on turnover, headcount, postcode and economic activity (NACE Rev. 2 section) for most of the parent companies and subsidiaries located in Spain for cross-checking against the main file.

2 Main file: Group structures

2.1 Description of the dataset

Identification codes	Employer identification number (CIF)/internal code. For foreign subsidiaries, a nine-digit code starting X999/internal code.
Time horizon	2020 and historical information for groups that have not reported information in the last four years
Unit of analysis	Parent companies of and subsidiaries belonging to consolidated non-financial corporate groups
Updating procedure	The year N-1 is loaded for the first time in November of year N and the previous years are updated.
Geographical area covered	Non-financial corporate groups whose parent companies are domiciled in Spain
Data source	Information drawn from the separate and consolidated financial statements filed at Mercantile Registries. For listed groups the information is drawn from the official financial statements filed at the Spanish National Securities Market Commission (CNMV), mainly from the notes to the financial statements.
Cleaning and processing of raw data	The raw data are cleaned and processed to improve their quality.
Format of the information	.csv file
Universe	Hierarchical relationships between non-financial corporations within consolidated non-financial corporate groups

Nomenclature	Code	Description
Financial year	ejercicio	Represents the Financial year to which the information in this row of the data file relates. Four digits long.
Employer identification number	cif	Represents the employer identification number (CIF) of the group's parent company. Nine alphanumeric characters long.
Internal code	Número interno	Internal Central Balance Sheet Data Office code enabling identification of a company even though its employer identification number has changed
Postcode	Código postal	Postcode associated with the company's registered office. Five digits long.
Net turnover	Cifra neta de negocio-B	Net turnover in thousands of euro
Headcount	Num. Empleados-B	The company's average headcount
NACE Rev. 2 section	Gran sector 2009-B	One alphanumeric character long. Limited list of values
Type of company	Tipo	Indicator of whether the company is a parent or subsidiary within the group structure.
