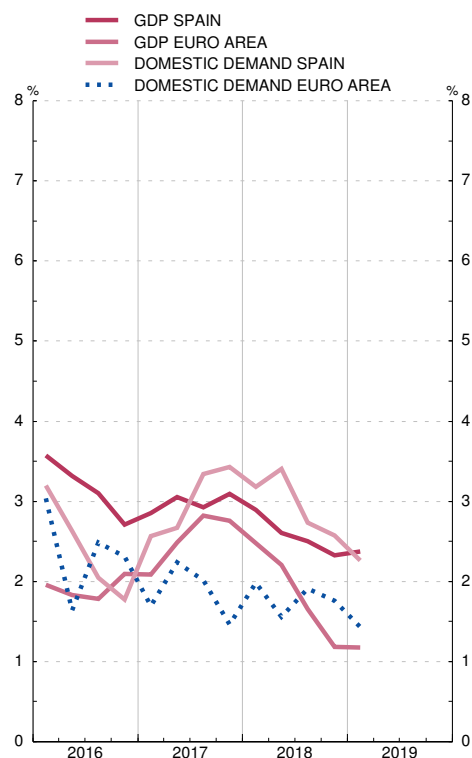

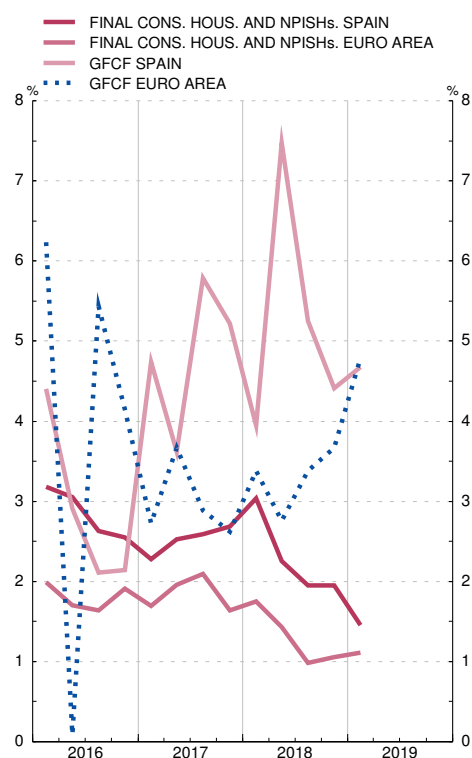

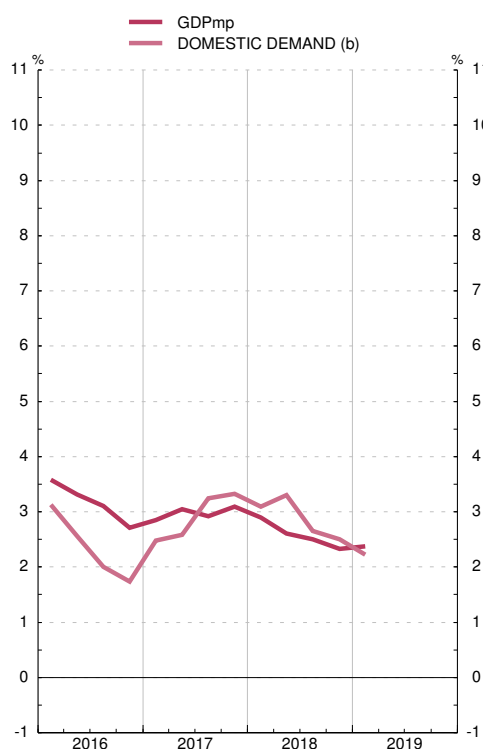

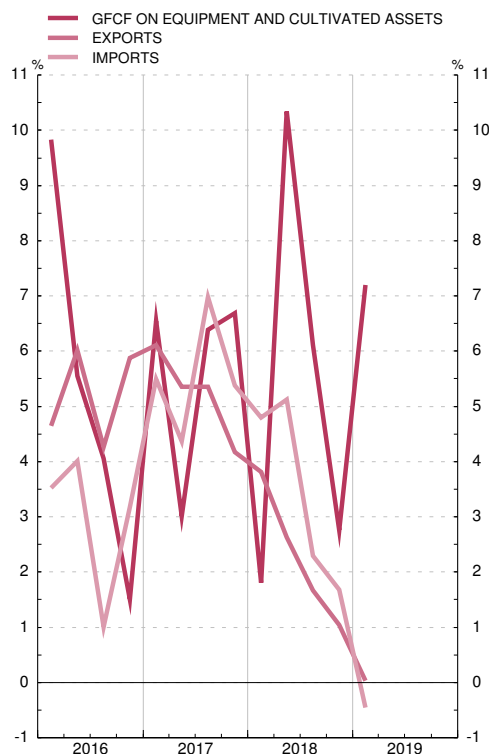

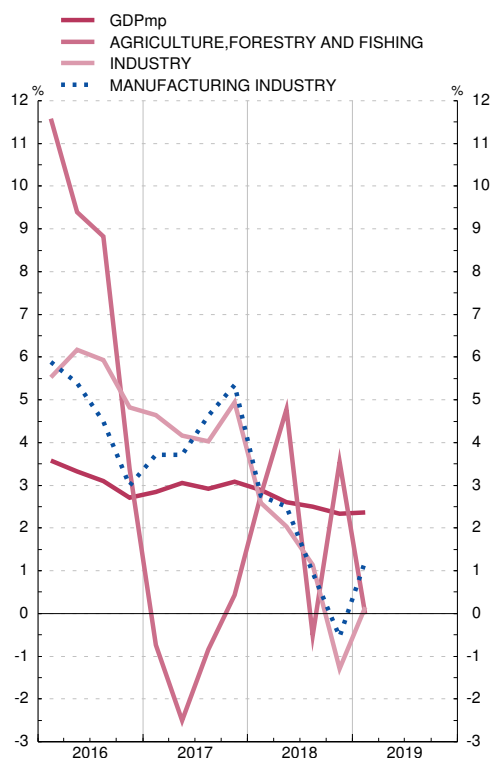

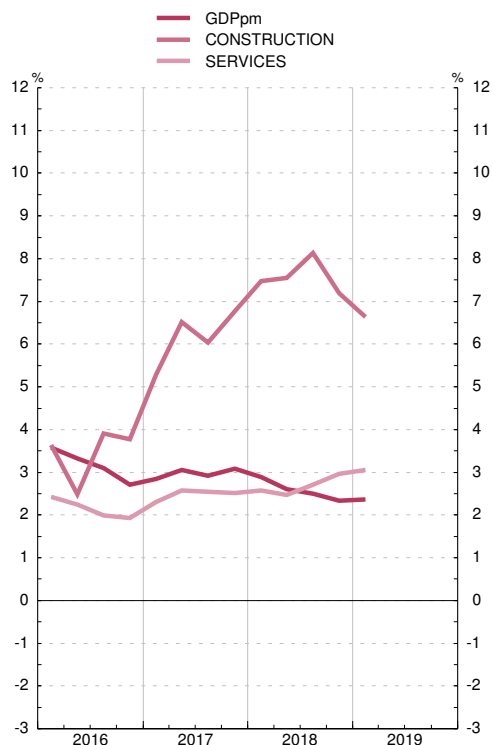

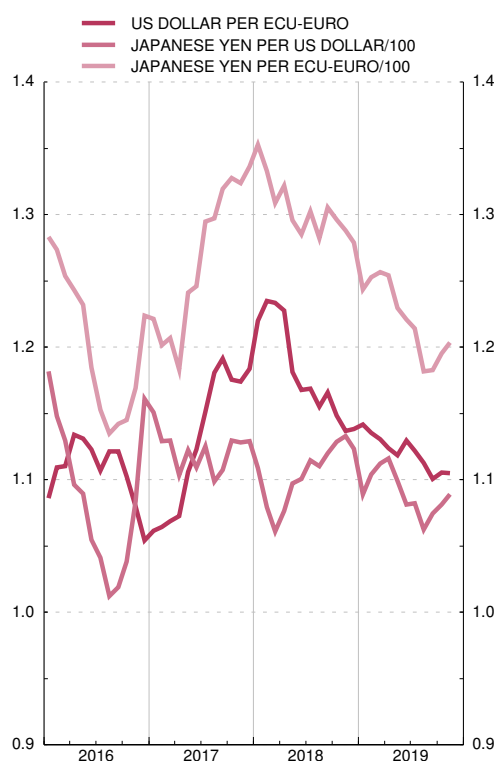

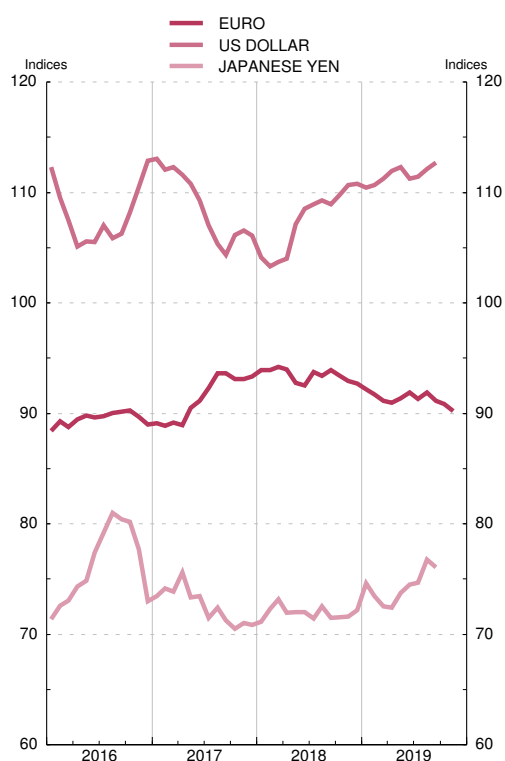

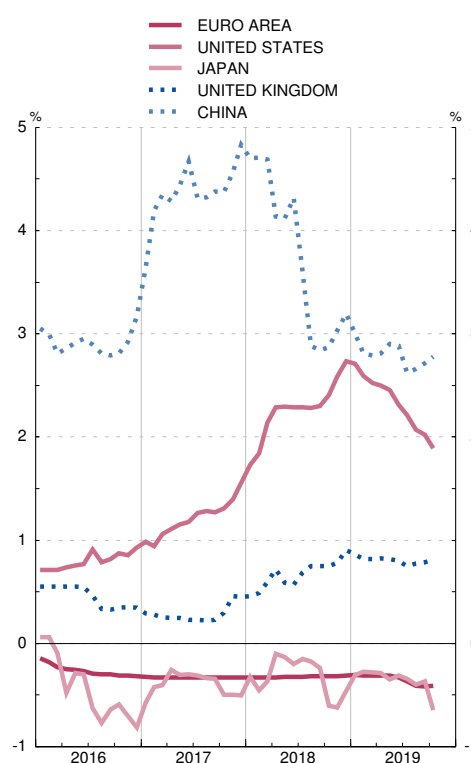

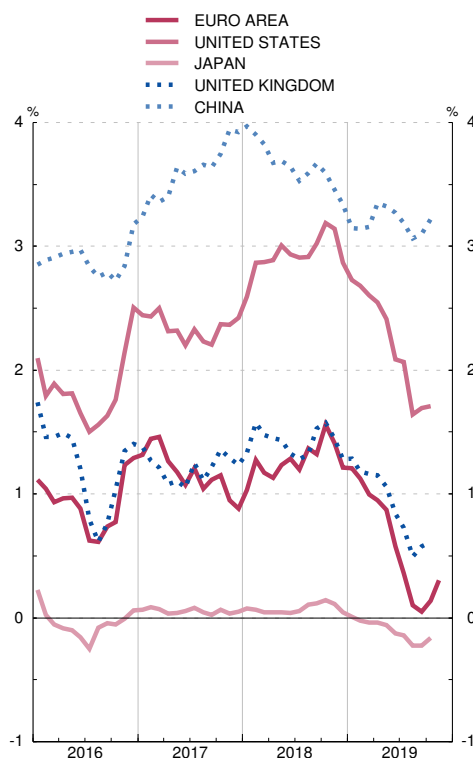

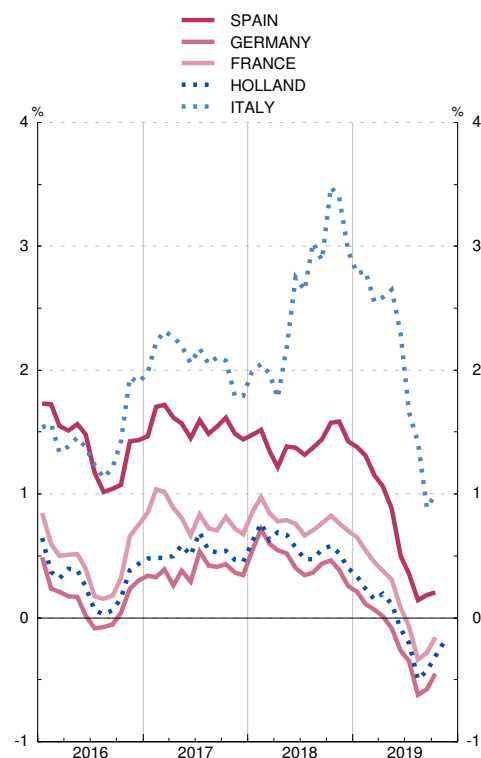

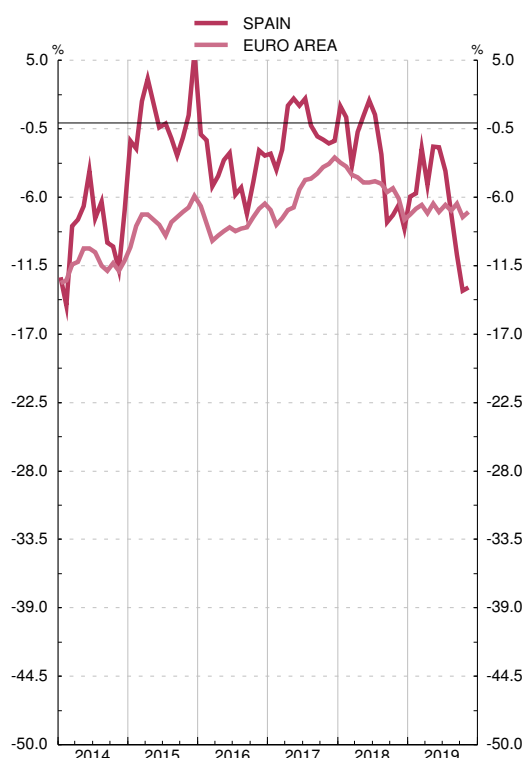

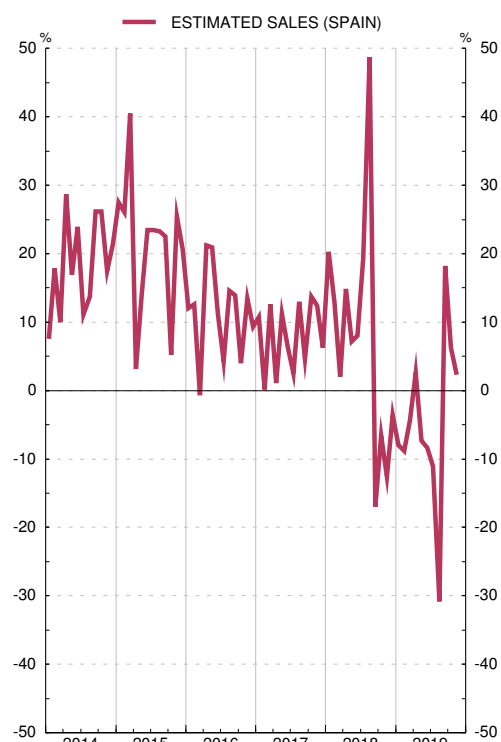

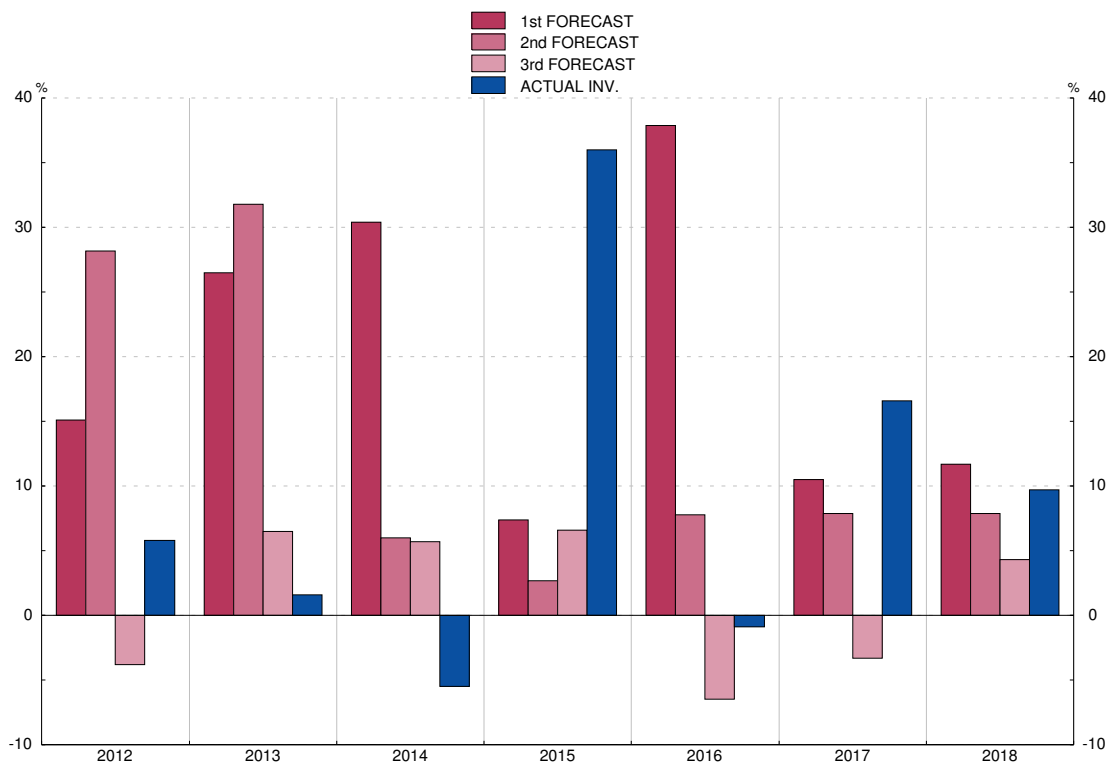

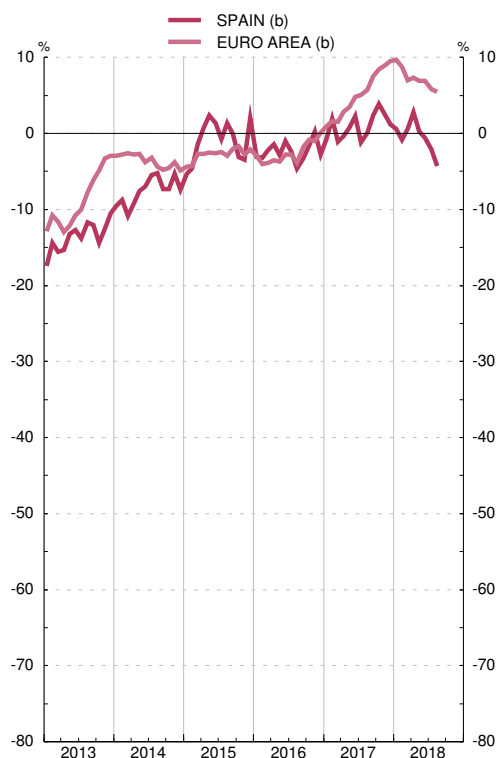

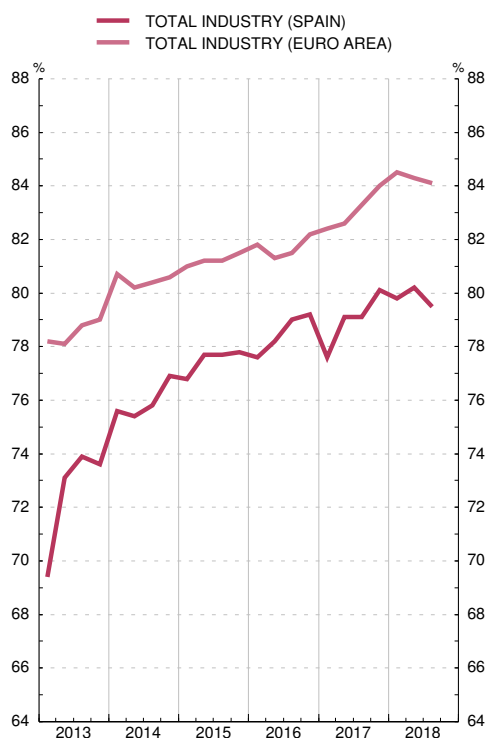

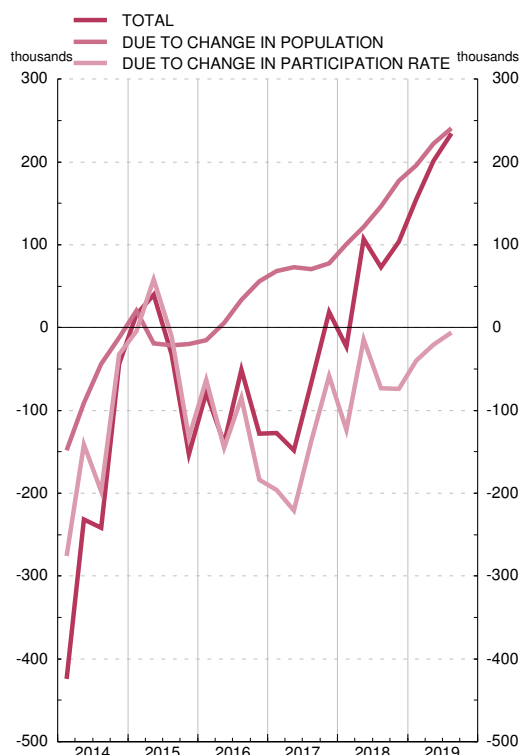

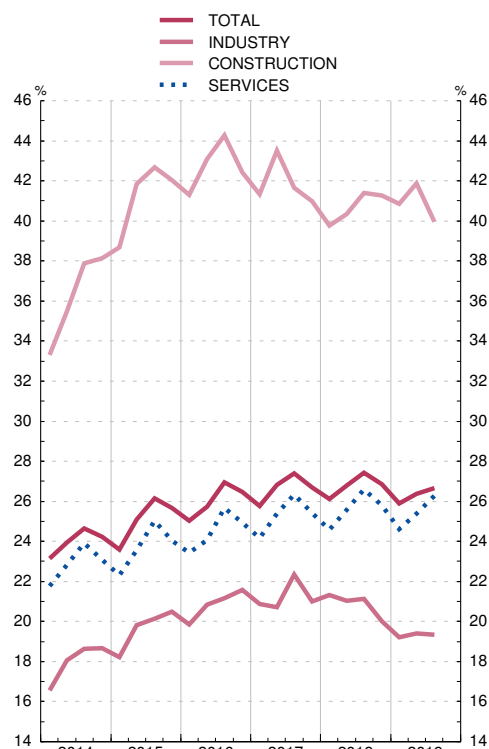

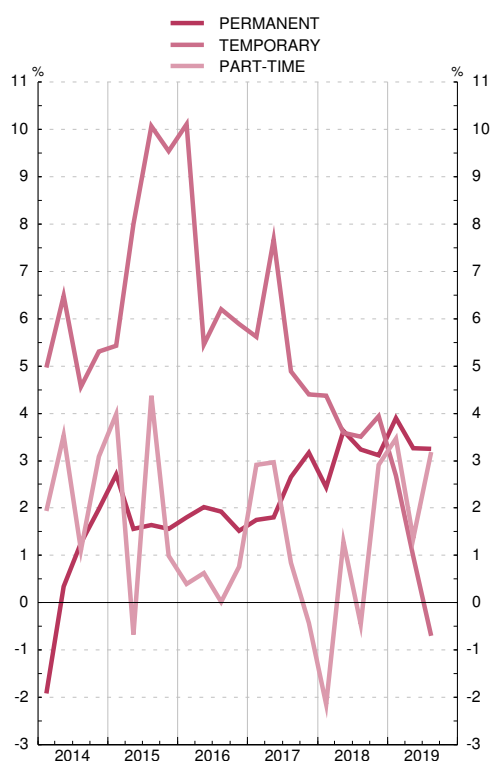

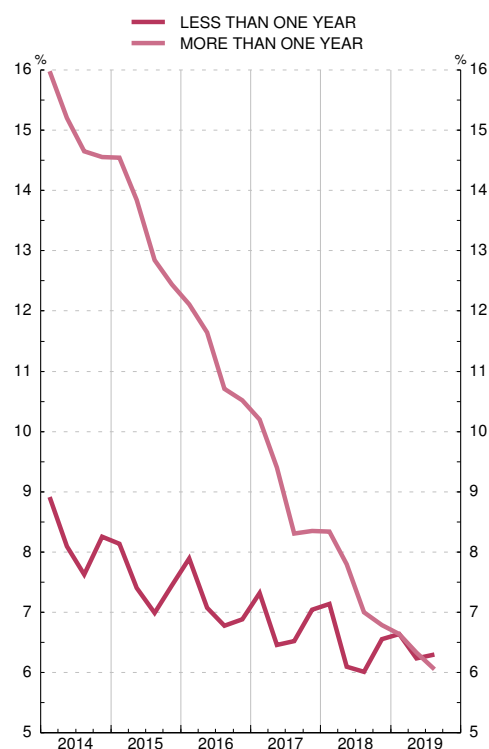

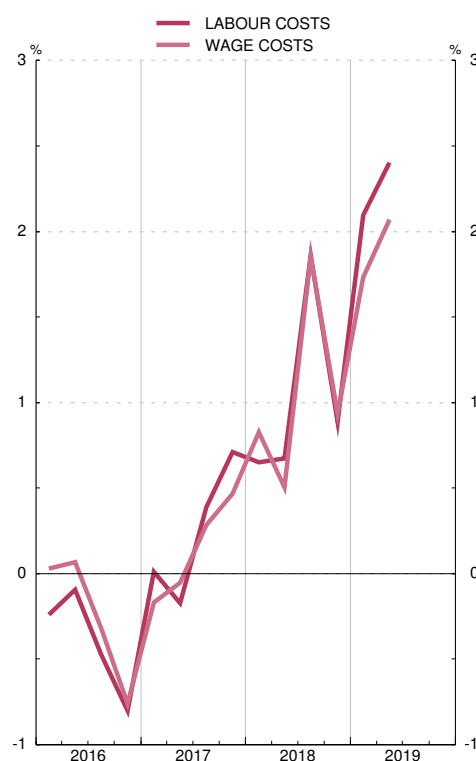

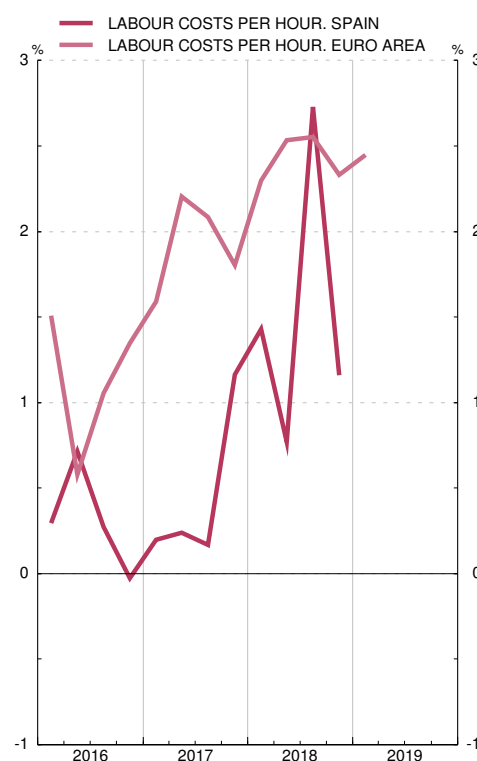

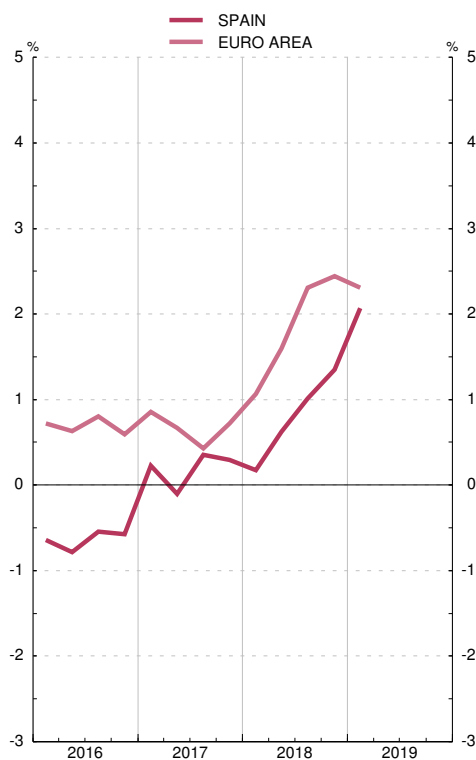

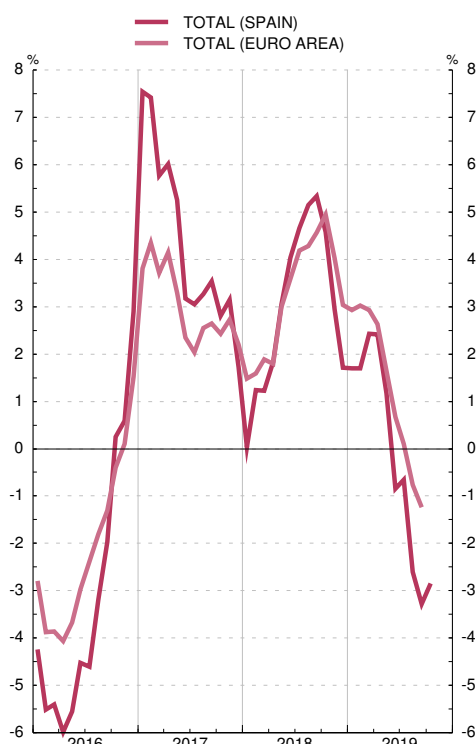

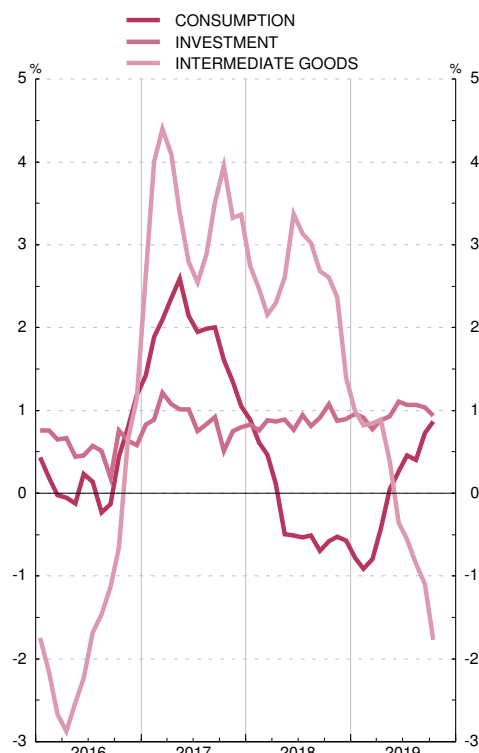

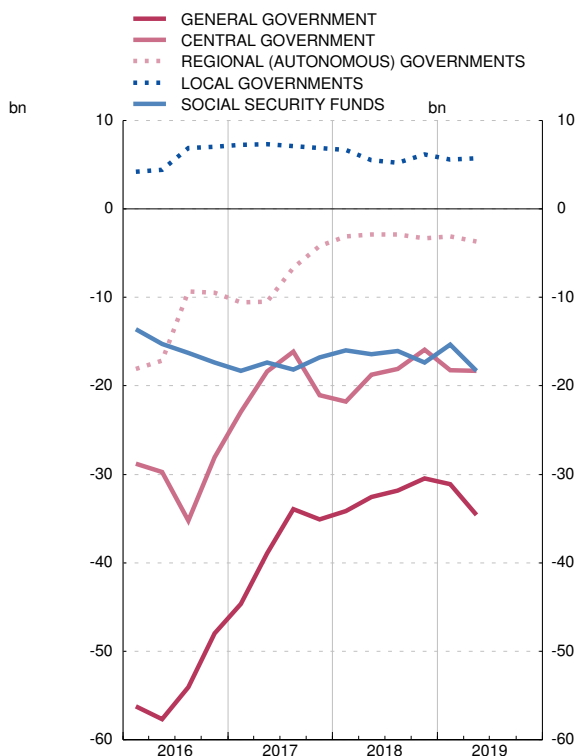

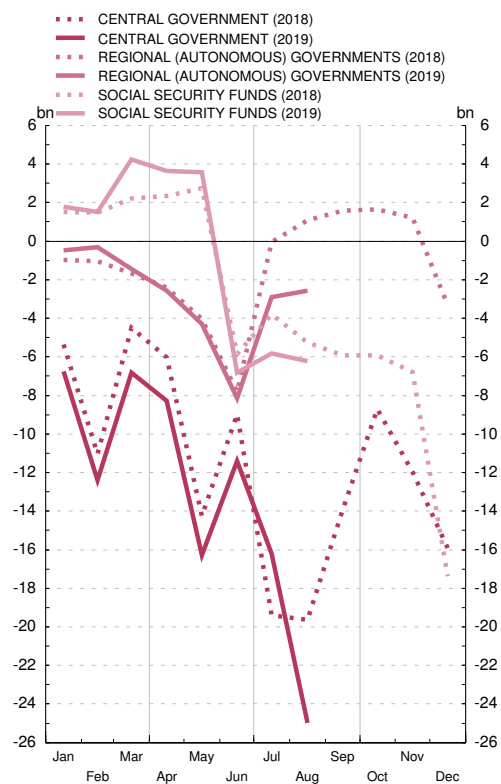

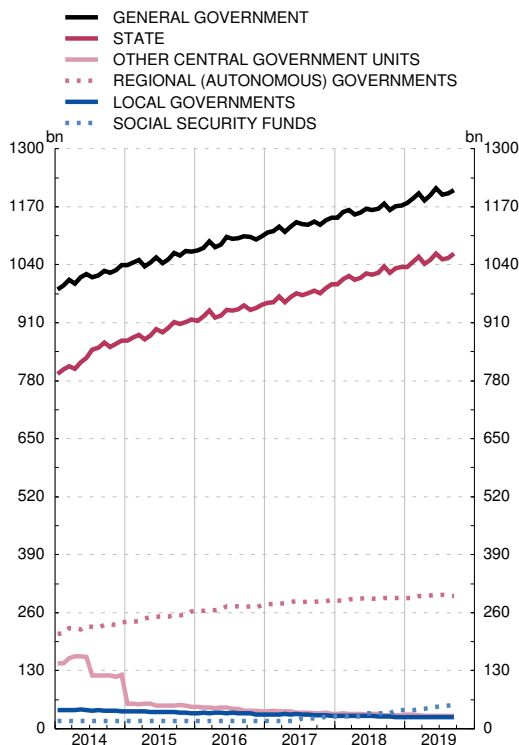

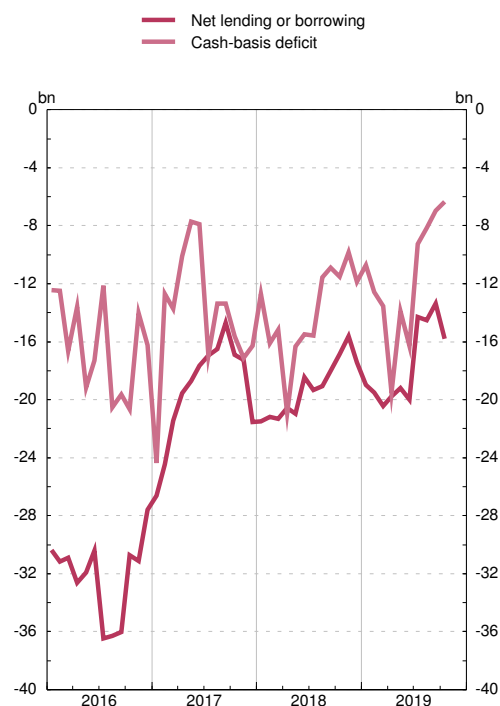

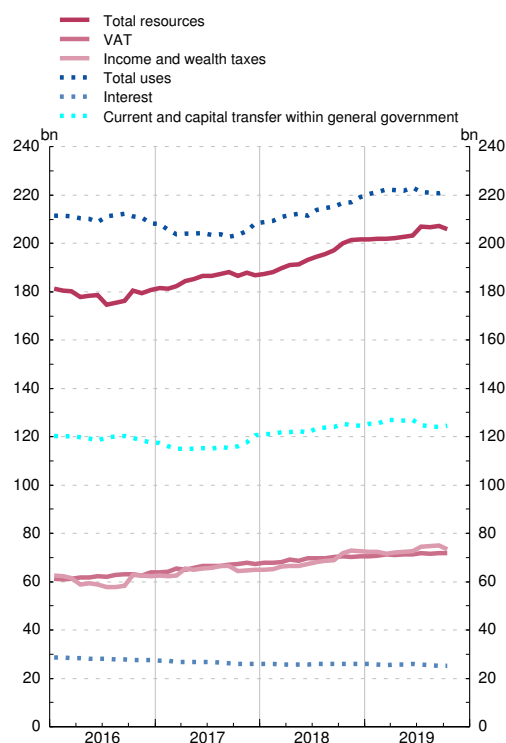

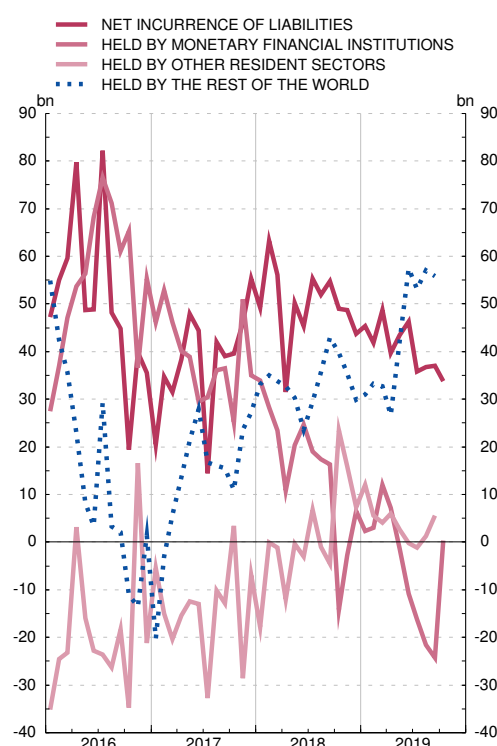

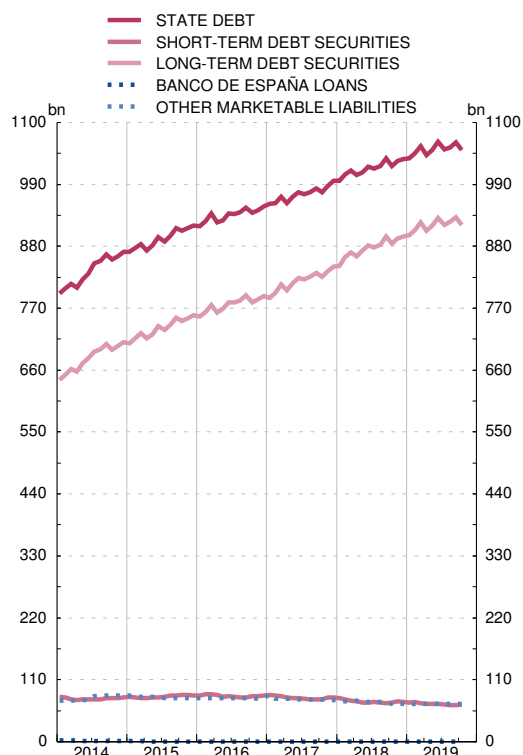

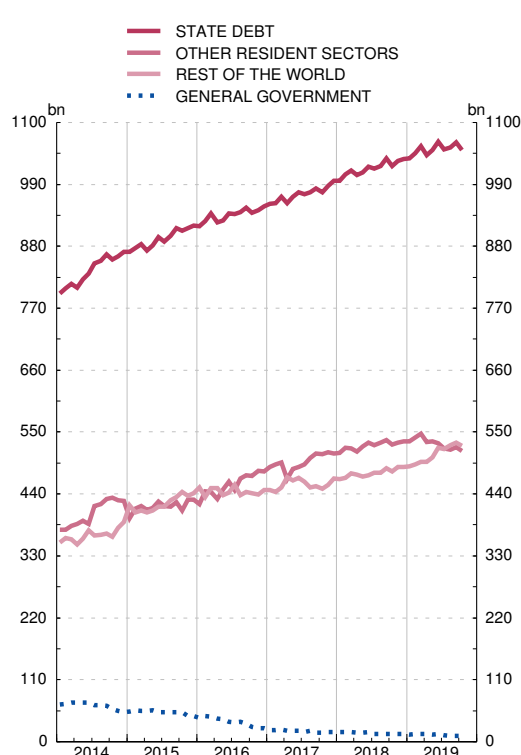

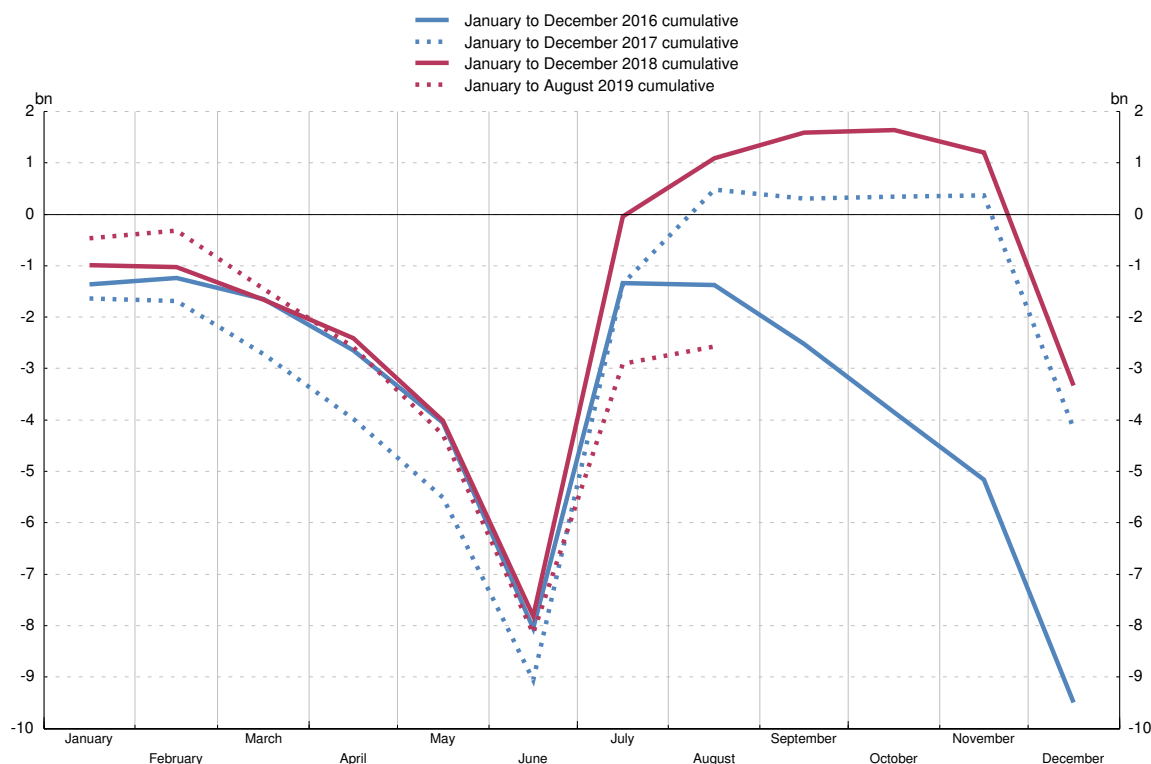

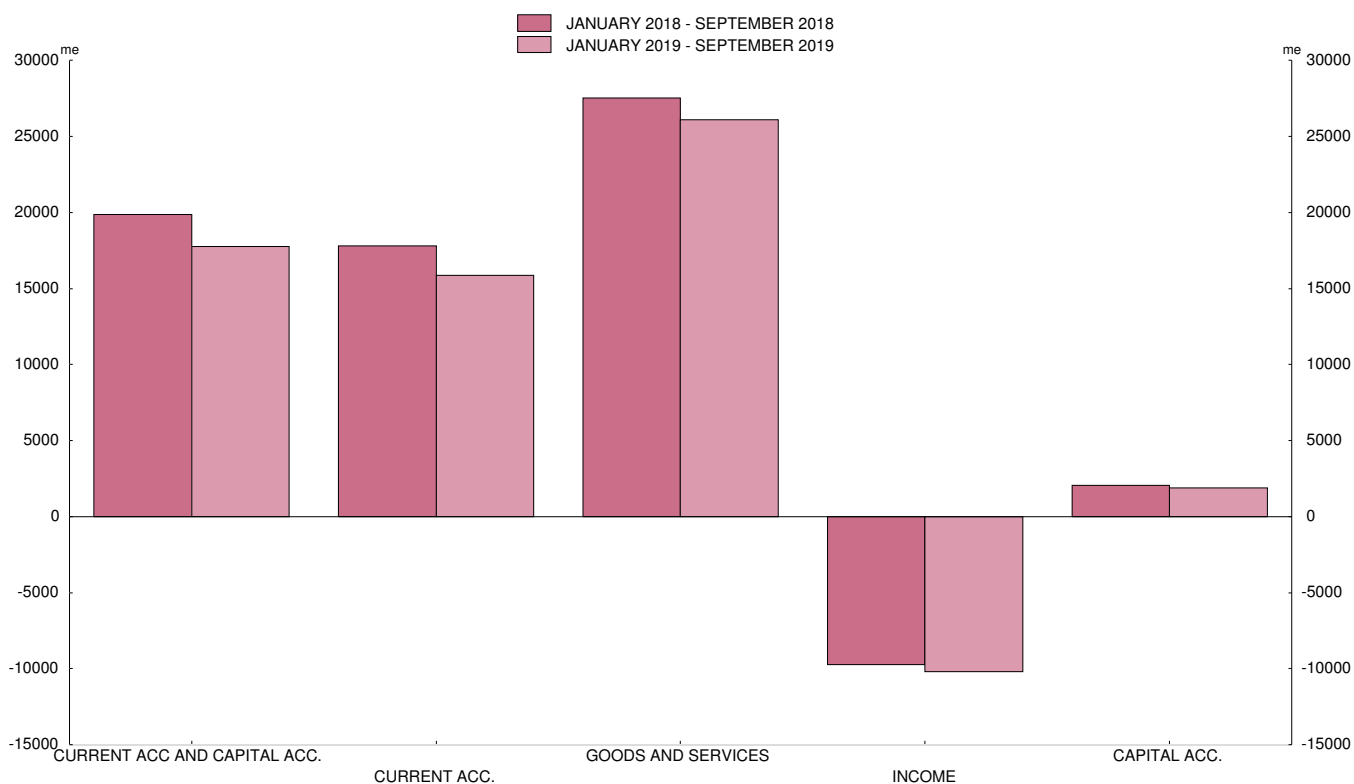

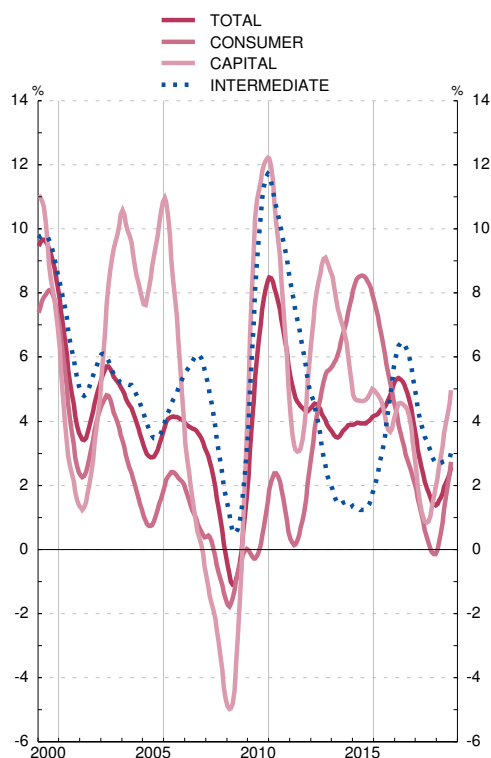

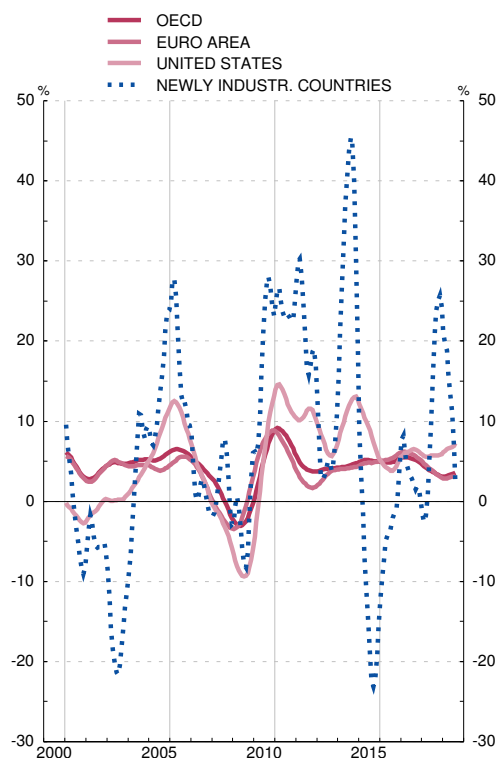
#### BY PRODUCT

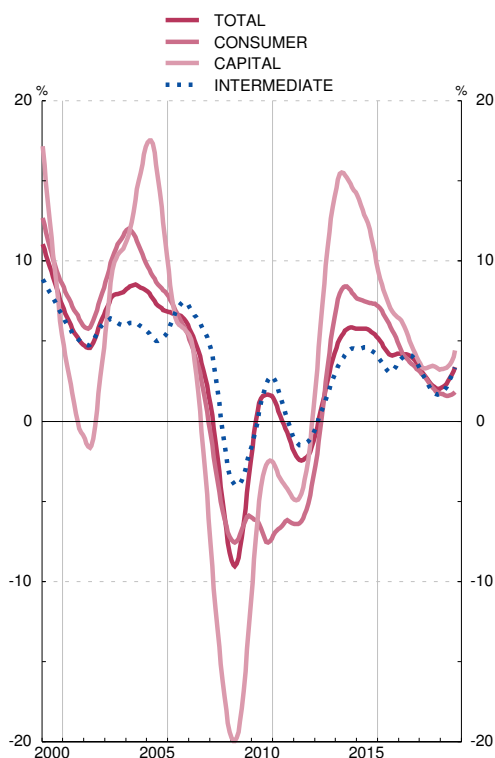

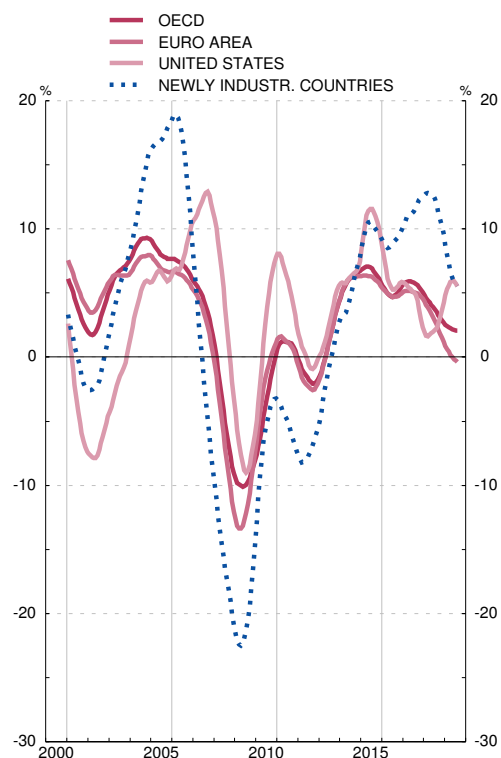
### BY PRODUCTS

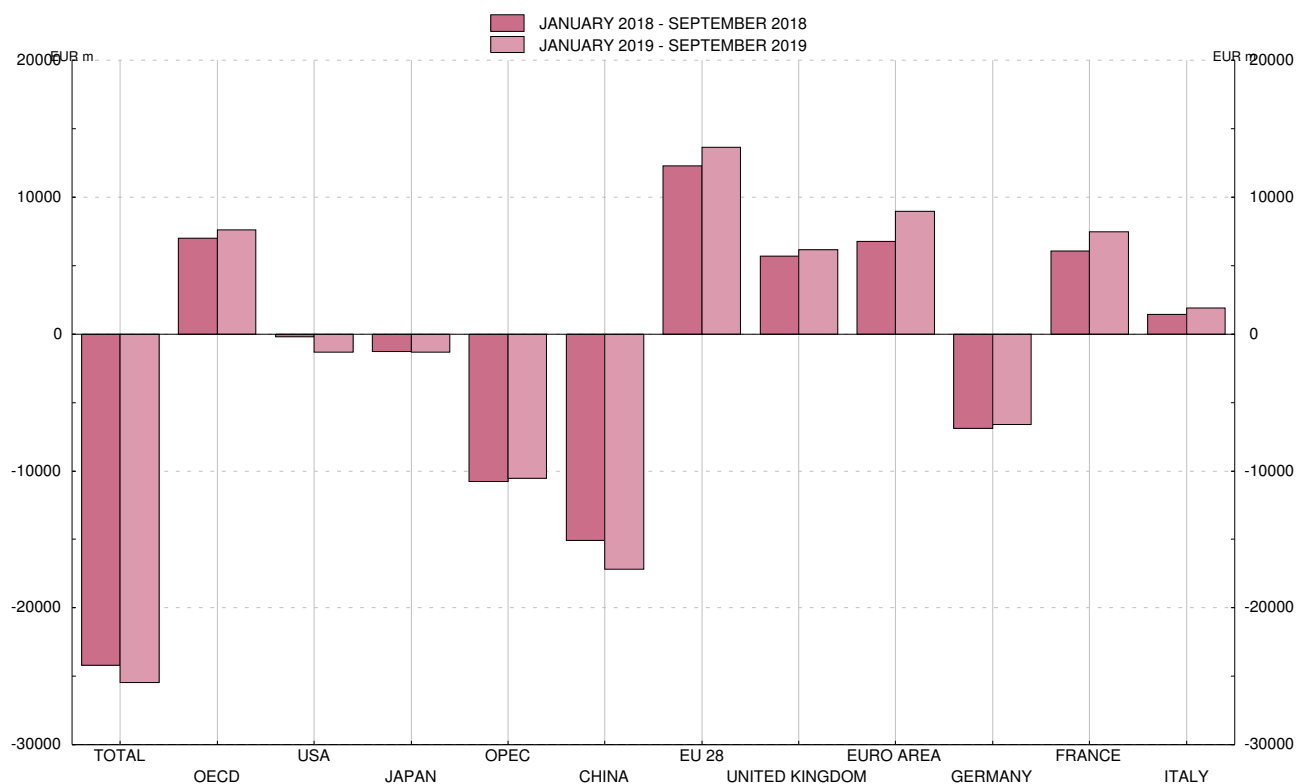

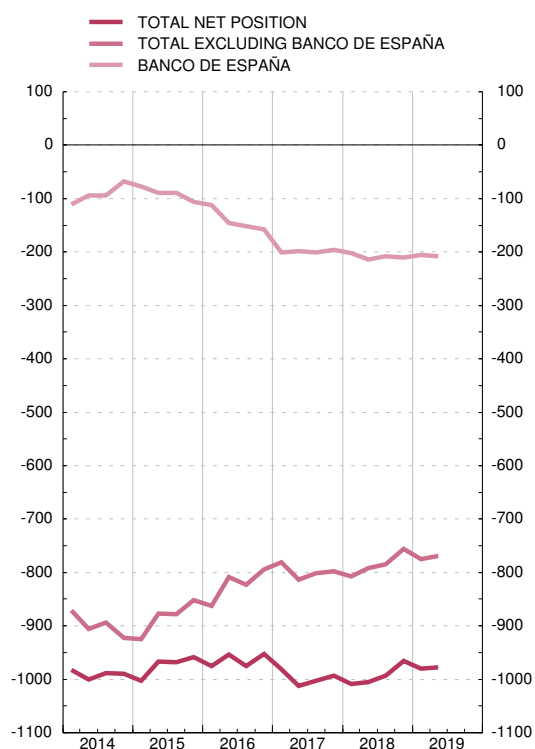

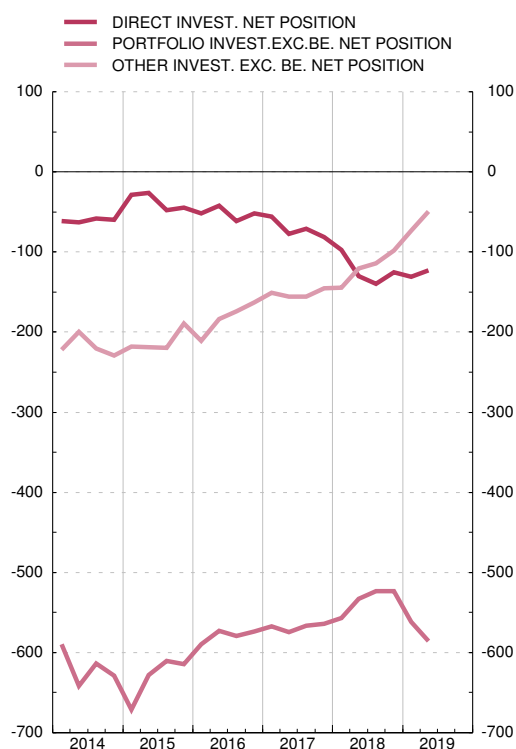

### COMPONENTS OF THE POSITION



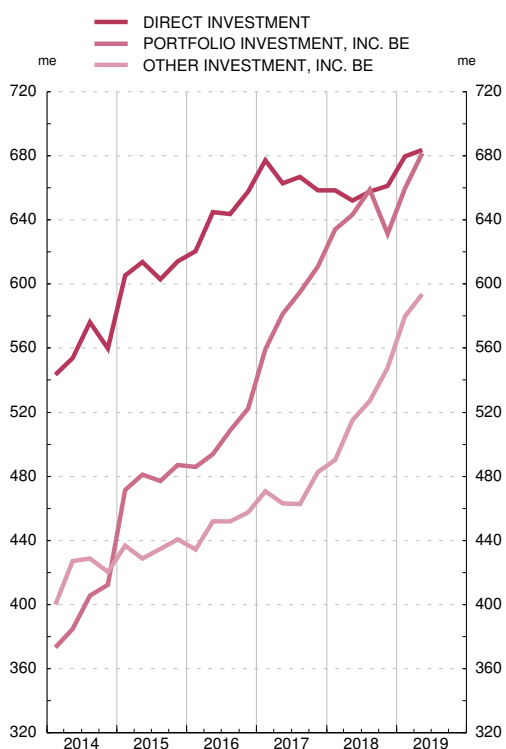

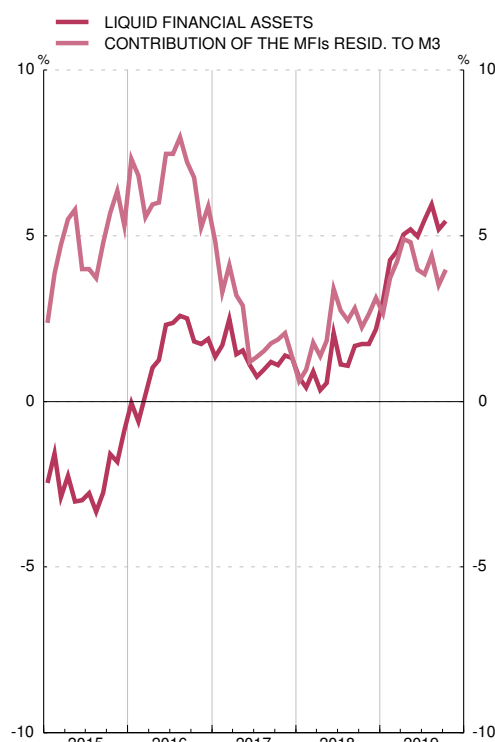

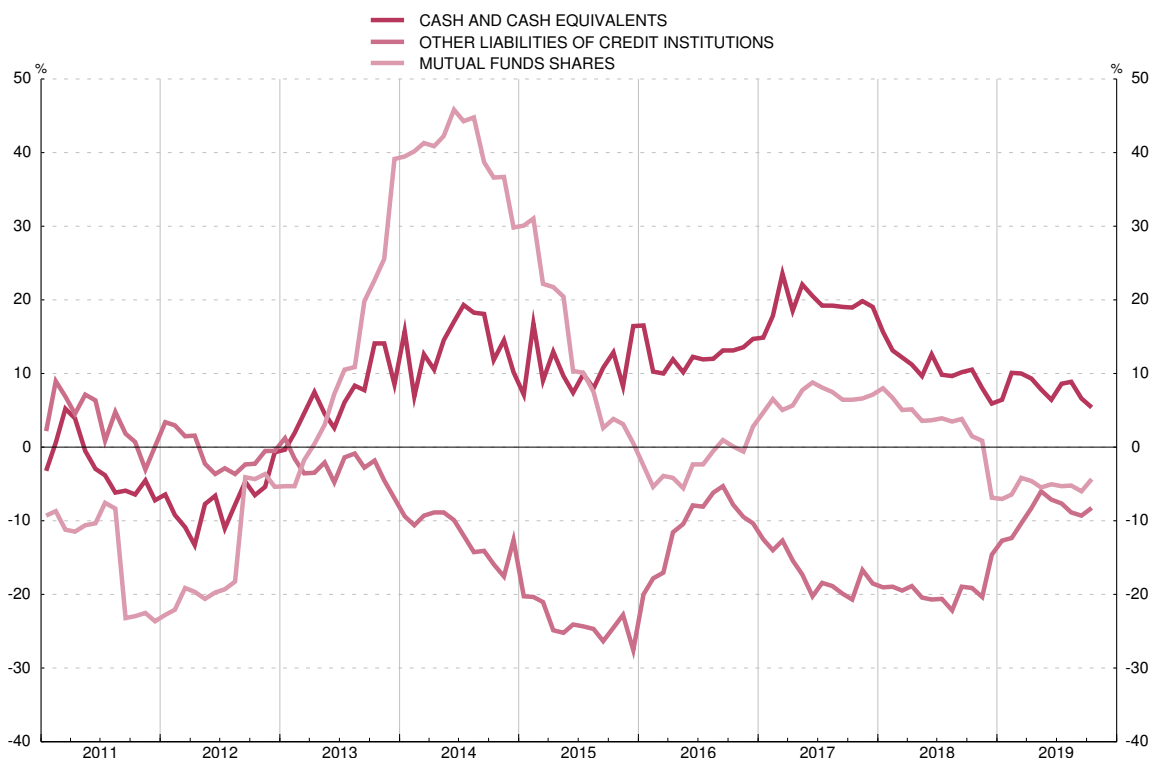

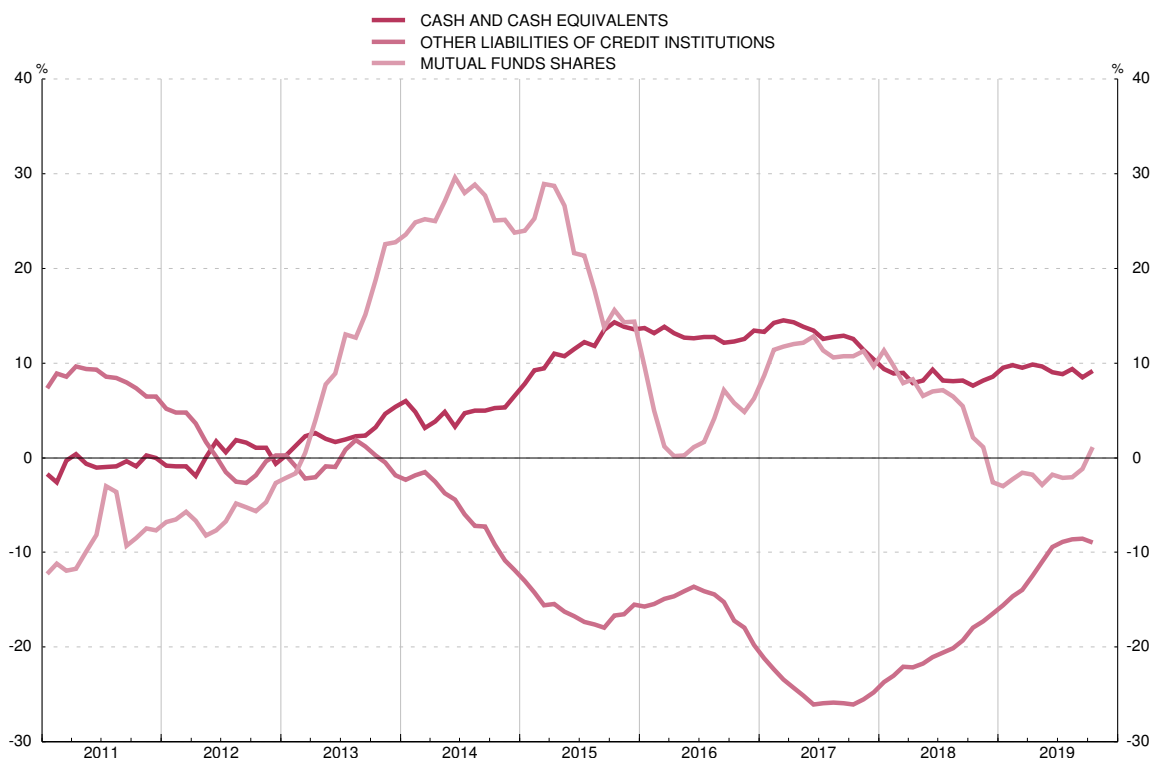

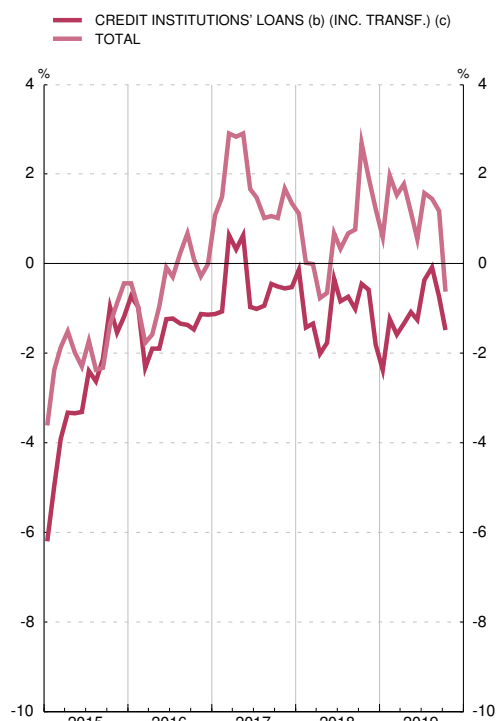

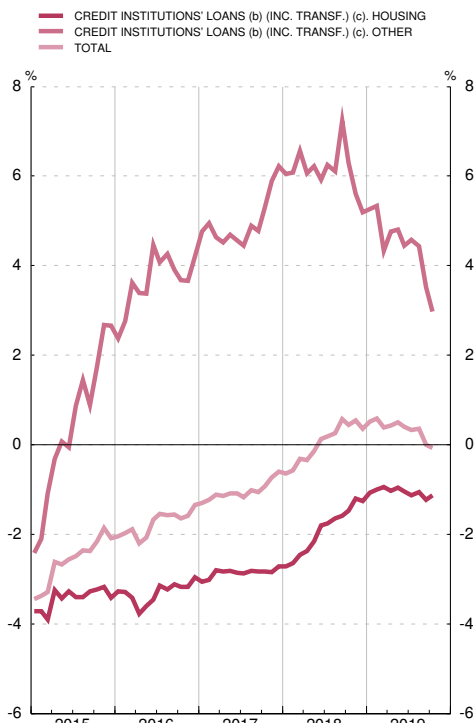

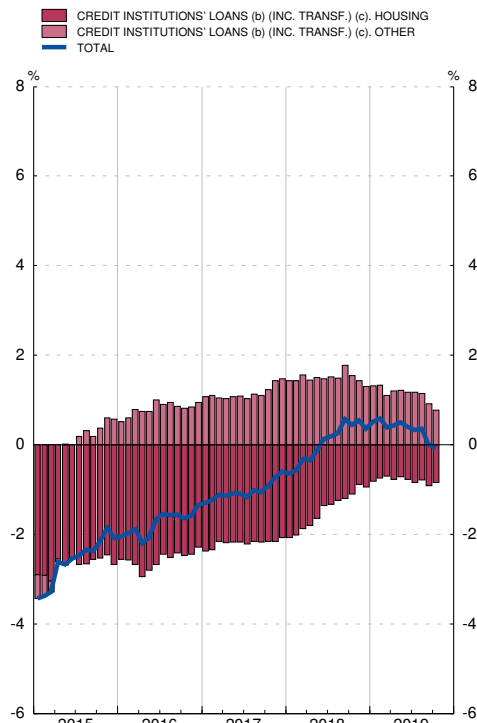

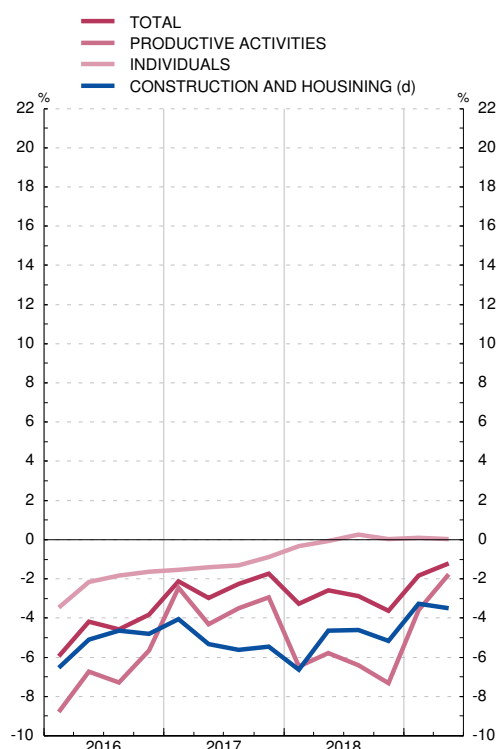

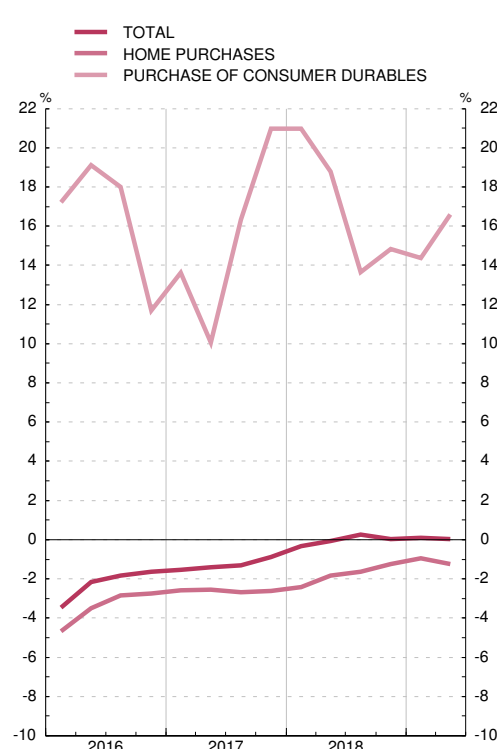

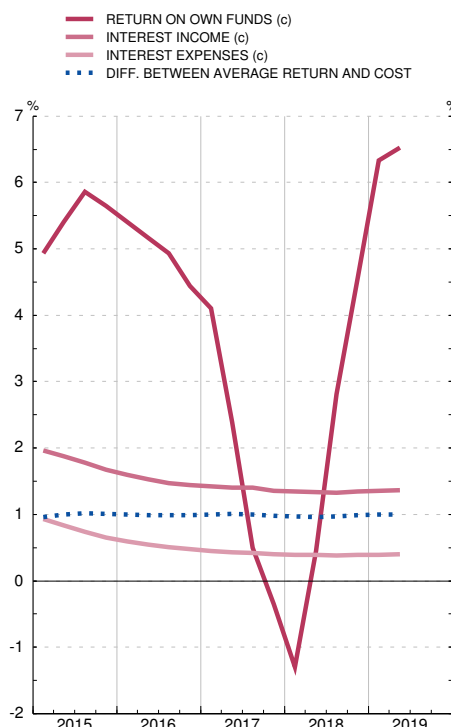

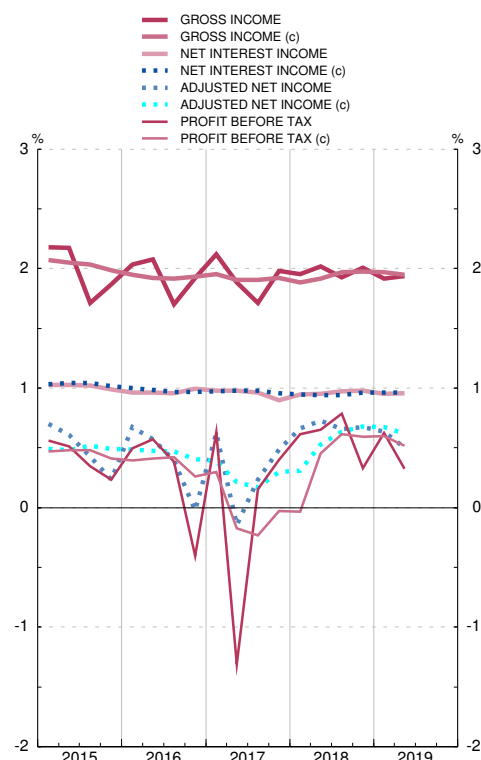

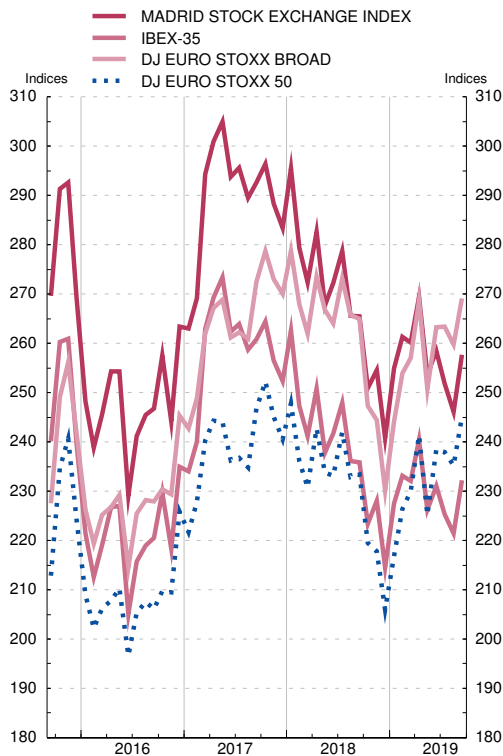

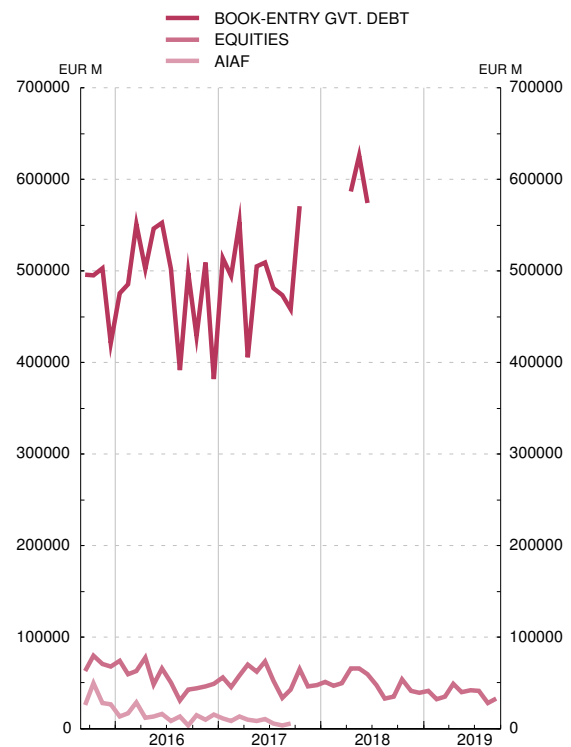

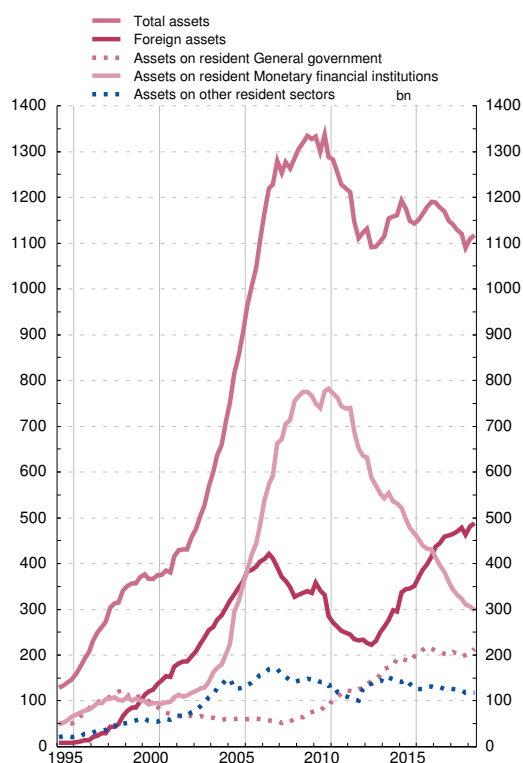

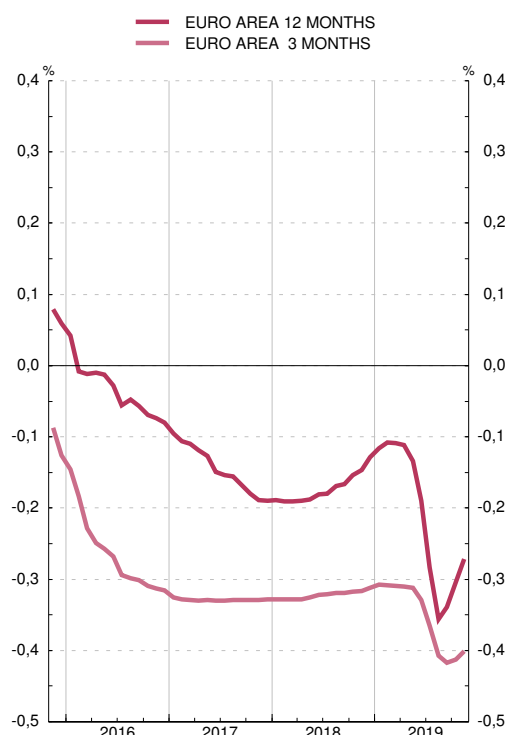

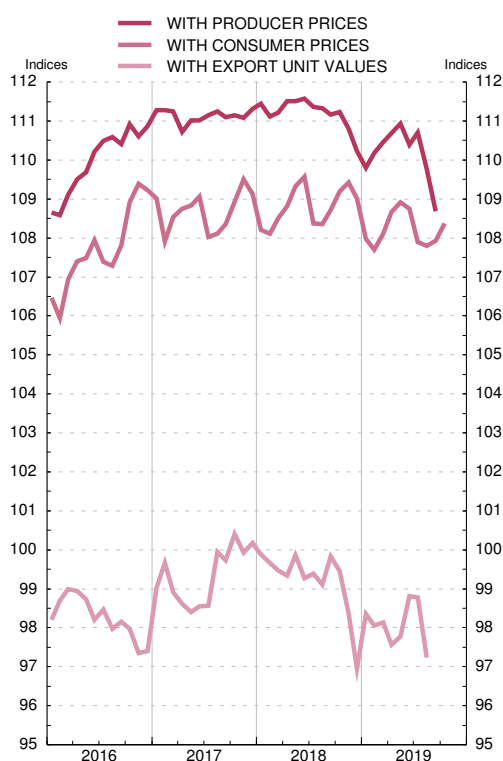

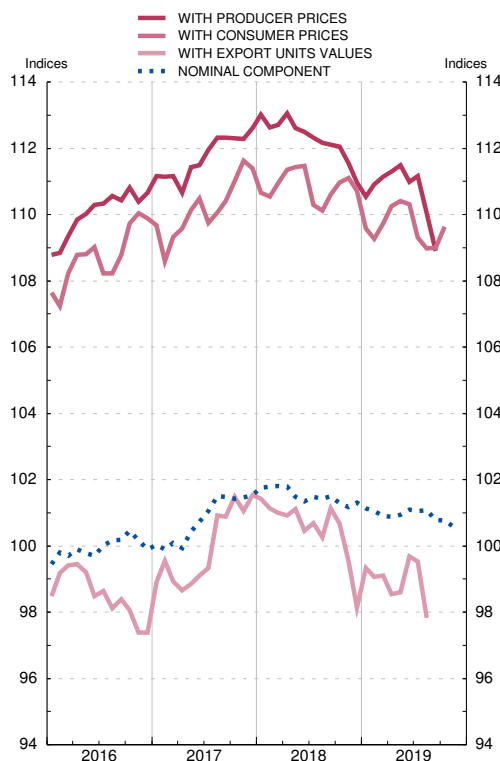

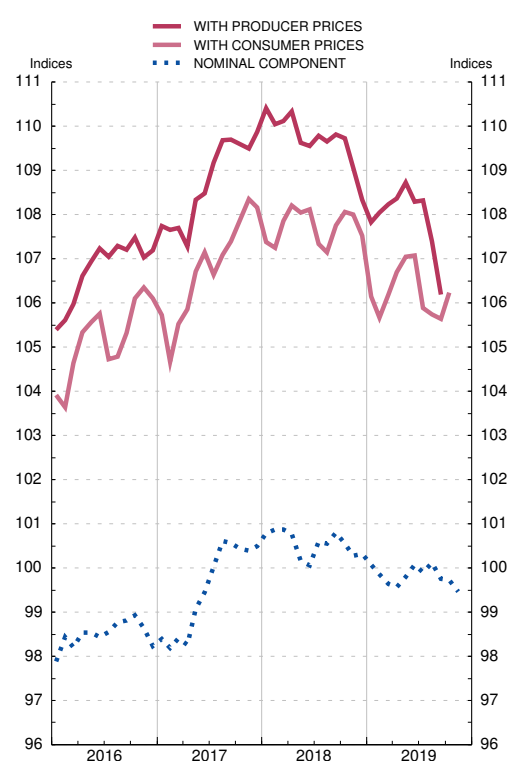
